


influence of alcohol. In the section marked "Sobriety," pay attention to which words the officer circled under "Officer's Opinion." Also note if the officer circled any words in the section marked "Type Test Given" for sobriety tests. In the same middle section below to the right, the officer is instructed to circle the area where the vehicle was damaged. Again, if you disagree with the information, contact us. We can help set the record straight. In the same middle section to the left, there are two small boxes marked "Speed Limit" and "Est. Speed." If the estimated speed is higher than the speed limit, you could have grounds for a legal case. Speeding accidents are among the most common – and most severe – car accidents.

In the lower section, fifth line down, there's a box marked "Other Contr. Circumstance." The codes for this box can be found in the lower left corner. These codes contain a wealth of

"Collision Event." Make sure the correct code number from this section is marked on report.

In the next section, the fourth line focuses on whether driver #1 was tired or driving under the

information. Certain codes are used for some of the most common causes of car accidents, including 04 for "Following Too Close," 06 for "Over Speed Limit," 17 for "DUI" and 27 for "Driver Not in Control." PAGE 2






